- private health insurance for medical assistance in Italy
- Learning Agreement Before the mobility

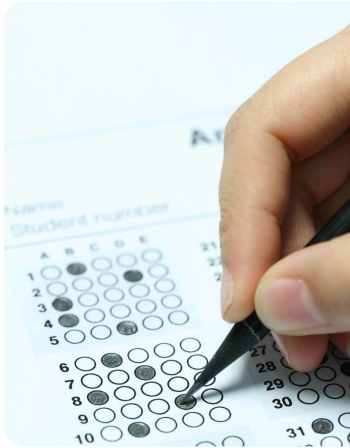

- Please only use Latin characters, with no diacritics (NO: à, á, è, é, ì, í, ò, ó, ù, ú, ñ, ç, ö, ü, ê, ê, ç, ł, đ etc.)
- Upload your photo on ESSE3 and follow the instructions contained in the FAQs to get your UNINT card.

*Please note that in case of students with special educational needs or specific learning disorders who may require exam accommodations, the home university is required to send an official communication during the nomination phase, together with the relevant medical or learning disability documentation for the nominated student(s).

Grading System & ECTS



Credit points

1 ECTS credit = 25 hours of total workload

ECTS & Grading system

Italian universities use a 30-point grading system.

From 0 to 17 the exam is failed. 18 is the minimum grade required to pass. 30 is the maximum grade.

30 cum laude is given when the work done by the student is excellent.

Laboratories and seminars give ECTS but they do not always have a grade, they are just assessed with a 'PASS' or 'FAIL'.

Italian language course for incoming students

UNINT offers all incoming students the opportunity to attend a **free Italian language course** for a total of **36 hours** per semester for **6 ECTS**.

The course is available in both the first and the second semester and is divided into two different levels (basic and intermediate-advanced).

Before classes begin, the Professor in charge will organise a placement test to assess your Italian language skills and assign you to the most suitable group.

Buddy programme

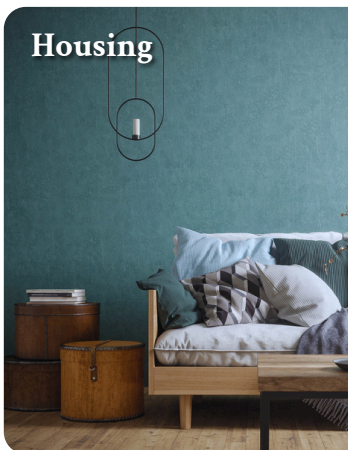


Incoming students will be asked whether they want to be assigned a UNINT **BUDDY**.

University facilities



All students are provided with **free wireless Internet** in the University buildings, a **UNINT institutional e-mail** account and **400 free photocopies** per month using our student printers.

Each student has free access to all University facilities: **cafeteria, restaurant service, library, garden...**



ESN (Erasmus Student Network) is the largest international student association of volunteers. It offers support to international students and organises many activities, trips and sports days.

Bureaucratic procedures

EU students



Students with an EU passport do not need a VISA to enter Italy.

However, if they plan to stay for more than three months, they have to request a document called **Iscrizione Anagrafica** at the office called *Municipio di Residenza*.

Students without an EU passport have to apply for a study VISA.

In order to start the study visa application, non-EU students must register on **UNIVERSITALY**

- when asked for the reason for issuing the VISA, you must select "**Erasmus+ or exchange programme**";
- do not select any UNINT degree. Click on the SINGLE COURSE option and write "EXCHANGE PROGRAMME" in the gap.

As soon as you receive your study VISA, please send a copy to our International Relations office.

Please have a look at the [EU Immigration Portal](#). Here you can find all the conditions to be met and the procedures to follow in order to study in Italy for more than 90 days.

Please bear in mind that once you enter Italy, you must apply for a **residence permit** for study purposes (**[EU Immigration Portal](#)** - [|| Portale Immigrazione - Poste Italiane](#)). When you go to the post office at the Sportello Amico desk, remember to bring with you the declaration issued by UNIVERSITALY portal.

Students without an EU passport have to show proof of certified health insurance coverage in Italy (it is recommended to have a copy certified by the Italian Consulate or by the Embassy in your own country).

Otherwise, foreign students can purchase a private insurance policy before their arrival in Italy.

Tax Code

CODICE
FISCALE



To open a bank account or sign a rental agreement in Italy, you will need a Codice Fiscale (Tax Code). **We strongly recommend applying for it in advance through the Italian Embassy or Consulate in your home country.**

If you are unable to get your Codice fiscale before coming to Rome, you can obtain your Tax Code at the Agenzia delle Entrate. The office closest to UNINT is located at Via Ippolito Nievo 48-50, email: dp.iroma@agenziaentrate.it (Metro line B, stop "Piramide", then tram no. 3 to Piazza Ippolito Nievo)

The Tax Code is an alphanumeric code based on your first name, family name and date and place of birth. It is used by the Italian public administration in order to identify citizens living in Italy.

Please bear in mind that the CODICE FISCALE automatically generated by ESSE3 or by UNIVERSITALY is not valid. The CODICE FISCALE, in order to be valid, must be assigned either by *Agenzia delle Entrate* or by diplomatic representations (Embassy or Consulate).
